Project Title: Napa River Salt Marsh Restoration Project Draft EIR/EIS, Napa, Solano, and Sonoma Counties

Project Abstract: The California State Coastal Conservancy (state lead agency), U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, San Francisco District (federal lead agency), and California Department of Fish and Game (responsible agency) are proposing a salinity reduction, water delivery, and habitat restoration project for the 9,456-acre Napa River Salt Marsh. The purpose of this project is to restore important tidal wetland habitat in San Francisco Bay, and the project includes three primary components to achieve the project objectives—salinity reduction, habitat restoration, and recycled water delivery. The lead agencies have prepared a Draft EIR/EIS, which describes and analyzes the potential environmental effects of proposed restoration project.

Comment Period: The comment period is from April **X**, 2003 to May **Y**, 2003.
